

Governor's Budget Plan: A political assault on Wisconsin's working families

In good times and tough times, Wisconsin's public service workers and elected officials from both parties have worked together to improve services and solve budget challenges. Now our anti-worker governor and some legislators are coming after our wages, our healthcare and our retirement – and the very bedrock of our effective working relationships: collective bargaining.

We're not alone. A nationwide, coordinated political assault is underway – funded by large, out-of-state corporations and greedy CEOs. Their goal here in Wisconsin? Strip away all the good-faith negotiating systems that have been protecting good jobs and services for years.

Governor Scott Walker's budget proposal is a serious threat. It's designed to nearly destroy our union and put in jeopardy everything we have worked so hard to build. In states with laws outlawing or strictly limiting collective bargaining, average workers make \$5,500 less a year, pay more for less health insurance, and see their pensions shrinking.
